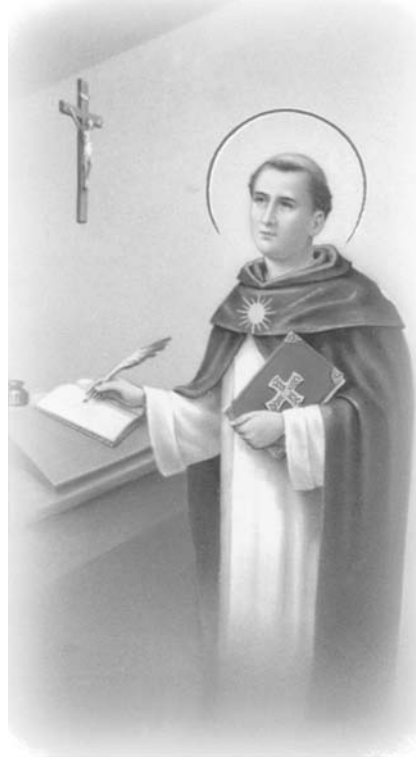

Dear Parishioners,

Before we begin the Holy Season of Lent, I want to fill you in on the latest parish news. As I mentioned in my last letter, our greatest challenge will be to keep our parish open. Our projected deficit for the current fiscal year is over \$130,000. If we continue on the road on which we now find ourselves, the outcome will not be a happy one. Therefore, I have turned to the Pastoral and Finance Councils for advice on moving us in a more favorable direction. These discussions resulted in the following **threefold plan of action**:

- We are looking to kick off an increased offertory campaign in the not too distant future. I have enlisted the services of Catholic Foundations of Greater Philadelphia for this important task. This organization will not only solicit money but will also challenge our inactive members to greater participation in the life of this parish. The primary source of income for any parish is the Sunday collection. **The future viability of this parish depends on your increased generosity.**
- Not wanting to put the entire burden on the 21% of people who practice their Catholic Faith, we are going to turn to fundraisers to supplement our income. We hope to launch a regular schedule of bingo this spring and a Lottery in the summer. Details will follow in the bulletin as these fundraisers take shape. **The success of these fundraisers will be contingent upon your participation in them and your active promotion of them among your friends and family.**
- Finally, we have hired NAIMertz to market our new school building. NAIMertz has generated various promotional materials both printed and digital and will give us regular updates on their progress.

As I have said before, the problem we face isn't primarily financial—it's spiritual. The long term solution to this problem is the return of the 79%. Over my twenty years of priesthood, I have heard various ideas about how to rectify this situation. First, build them a school and they will come. Today most students, who attend Catholic schools, don't participate in Sunday Mass. Second, build them a sports program and they will come. Sadly, sport is the god of choice worshipped by many Catholic families. Third, provide more activities for adults and they will come. St. Thomas has tried that long before I ever got to this parish. Some don't get involved in the activities, and others come only for the activities. Finally, and most recently, build them a social media network and they will come. It's worth a try.

There is some truth to all of the above proposals but all have one common flaw: they confuse the icing for the cake. The main obstacle to a vibrant Catholic Church in many parts of the western hemisphere is the culture in which we live: moral relativism (I'm ok, you're ok), materialism (money first), and the collapse of the traditional American family. **It is my own, personal opinion that the return of the lost will only come about through a traumatic personal, national, or international event.** I think the brief return of people to Church after 911 illustrates this. In the meantime, we need to be ready to welcome these people when they are ready to return.

On a very different topic, I encourage you to start making preparations for a good Lent. Consider what your parish has to offer:

- Daily Mass at 8:30 AM every weekday in the chapel
- Weekly, Saturday Confessions and extra evening Confessions during the last three weeks of Lent
- Adult Education on Mondays. This year we want to learn more about spreading the Good News
- Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament every Monday after Mass with Benediction at 3:30PM
- Stations of the Cross on Tuesday evenings and Sundays after the 11:00AM Mass
- Forty Hours Devotion/Parish Mission in the beginning of April. Details to follow
- Various opportunities to practice almsgiving especially by supporting our St. Vincent DePaul Society

Lent is about so much more than giving up chocolate, but don't forget to add extra prayer and fasting to your penitential routine.

### **Fast and Abstinence and Other Acts of Penance for Lent 2017:**

- \* Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.
- \* Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- \* On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- \* All the faithful are encouraged to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily.
- \* To celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance.
- \* To undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten educational programs.
- \* Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.
